For those who need it, there are **gluten free** communion wafers available - please pick up one of the yellow cards at the front desk and hold it in your hand when you come to the rail.

WEEKDAY AND SUNDAY EVENING SERVICES IN JANUARY

There are no regular weekday or Sunday evening services at Holy Trinity over the holiday period. The Wednesday service resumes on **31 January**, the Thursday service on **1 February**, and Sunday evening services on **4 February**. Services at St Matthias', Windermere continue as normal on the second and fourth Sundays at 9am.
