### **Lament and Repentance during Lent**

During Lent 2018, Bishop Condie is encouraging all churches and organisations in the Diocese of Tasmania to observe a season of **Lament** and **Repentance** for our failures in the past, with particular focus on:

- our failure to **respect and care for children** (as found by the Royal Commission)
- our failure to **protect families from violence**
- our **misuse of power**
- our failure to **love and honour the first peoples of Tasmania**
- our failure to **protect the environment**, and
- our failure to **make disciples**.



Our hope and prayer is that this will be a time of spiritual healing for our Diocese and a preparation for where God will lead us in the future. As part of this, the Bishop is aiming to visit each parish for an hour of prayer during Lent and is inviting parishioners and others to join him. He will visit Holy Trinity **this coming Thursday 22 March at 8.00am**.

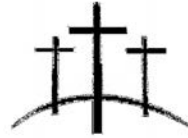
### **Grapevine**
